Regular Meeting June 3, 2019

The Mayor and Council for the City of Maysville met on Monday, June 3, 2019, 7:00 p.m. at 4 Homer Street.

Present: Mayor Richard Presley, Councilmembers Kathleen Bush, Junior Hardy, Richard Parr, and

Scott Harper, City Administrator/City Clerk Barbara Thomas.

Mayor Presley opened up the meeting with the invocation and prayer given by Councilmember Junior Hardy.

MINUTES:

The minutes of May 6, 2019 Special Called Meeting and May 6 Regular Meeting was approved as read upon a motion made by Councilmember Kathleen Bush, seconded by Scott Harper. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

A quote of \$8200,00 (per well) was received from Oconee Well Drillers for equipment materials and labor necessary to remove existing submersible pumping system and lay on ground adjacent to pump house, furnish and install all necessary equipment and to perform a 72 hour aquifer test. EMI will pull microbiological, chemicals and radiological samples and ship them for testing. This cost should range from \$1,000.00 to \$1,400.00 per well. The total amount for testing both wells should not exceed \$19,200.00. A motion was made by Councilmember Richard Parr, seconded by Kathleen Bush to accept the cost of \$19,200.00 for the service. Motion carried.

The city received one bid for paving half of Newton Street next to Dollar General with concrete. The bid was from Griffin Brothers, \$25,418.00. A motion to accept the bid was made by Councilmember Scott Harper, seconded by Councilmember Richard Parr. Motion carried.

The City has to renew their status "Certified City of Ethics" with a resolution. This has to be renewed every 4 years. The resolution was read by Mayor Presley and approved upon a motion made by Councilmember Scott Harper, seconded by Kathleen Bush. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

The conceptual design for the Amphitheater was tabled. EMI will be doing the Engineering on the project.

Chairman Ken Outcalt made a recommendation to the Council to appoint Mr. Robert Goodwin to the zoning board replacing Bobby Jones. A motion was made by Councilmember Richard Parr, seconded by Councilmember Kathleen Bush to approve the recommendation from the board. Motion carried.

Ken Outcalt handed out copies of the proposed Ordinance Amendment that the zoning board had been working on. Article 16: Section 1. Nuisances and Section 11. Repair, close or demolition of unfit structures by city. This will be reviewed by the Council and forwarded to the City Attorney before any action is taken.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Councilmember Richard Parr stated that he would be meeting with the group to discuss the July 4, 2019 celebration & Fireworks on Tuesday, June 4, 2019 at city hall. The event will take place Friday, July 5, 2019 in Veteran's Park.
