The Council approved \$2,350.00 to be paid to HBC Technology, LLC to replace the fascia board at the library. This will be paid out of Jackson County SPLOST Buildings account. The motion to approve was made by Councilmember Scott Harper, seconded by Councilmember Richard Parr, Motion carried.

Gina Wright with the Georgia General Assembly Office of Legislative & Congressional Reapportionment has assisted the city with updating the Ward Map since the new census came out. A draft copy was presented to the Council and was approved upon a motion made by Councilmember Richard Parr, seconded by Councilmember Junior Hardy. Motion carried. This will be presented to the Office of Legislative & Congressional board for approval.

The Road & Bridges Tax (TSPLOST) is up for a vote and will be on the Banks County November ballot. A meeting will be held with Banks County Board of Commissioners on Thursday, March 3, 2022, 6:30 p.m. in the Board Room of the Banks County Annex to discuss the projects for Maysville. The Mayor and Council will work on the list before the March 3, 2022, meeting with Banks County. They also talked about leaving the projects the same as the last five years..
