MAYSVILLE CITY COUNCIL ORDINANCE NO. 2010 -02

An Ordinance to provide for the establishment of fees on Application for Building Permit in the City of Maysville; to repeal conflicting ordinances; to provide for severability; to provide for an effective date; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Maysville is authorized by the Constitution of the State of Georgia to enact ordinances for the health, safety, and welfare of the general public; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Maysville, Georgia is authorized to require that any applicant for a building permit pay an appropriate administrative fee to the City of Maysville for processing such application; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of Maysville, pursuant to an agreement with Jackson County, Georgia, has authorized and agreed for the Jackson County Building Inspection Office to conduct necessary inspections as part of the permitting process, and to issue building permits;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Maysville, Georgia, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of same, as follows:

Section I. The City Council of Maysville is hereby authorized to establish by resolution a fee for the intake of building permit applications as follows:

1. An administrative application fee shall be charged by the City on each such building permit application accepted by the City Clerk in such amount as established by the City Council by resolution, which fee shall be collected by the City Clerk prior to accepting the permit application for processing.

Section II. Effective Date. The effective date of this Ordinance shall be the date of final passage.





Section III. The City Council of Maysville is authorized to continue its agreement appointing the Jackson County, Georgia Building Inspection Department as the entity to review, conduct inspections, and issue such building permits until the City Council of Maysville changes such authorization by resolution. Any fees charged by the Jackson County Building Inspection Office for its services shall be retained by Jackson County and such charge shall be separate from any administrative fee assessed by the City Council pursuant to the resolution adopted pursuant to this Ordinance.

Section IV. Severability. If any portion of this Ordinance should be declared invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity shall not be construed to affect the portions of this Ordinance not so held to be invalid or unconstitutional. Any ordinance in direct conflict with this Ordinance is repealed, and this Ordinance shall control over all prior ordinances in conflict herewith. However, to the extent possible, all prior ordinances shall be construed to be consistent with this Ordinance.


